learning and has been Director of the Port Elliot Kindergarten for the last 6 years. She was originally a high school teacher, but retrained in Early Childhood after her daughter attended kindergarten. Kindergarten projects she has initiated and led included a focus on listening, engaging parents in leanning, Ngarrinjeri perspectives and culture, revegetation of Basham's Beach, harvesting and sandbagging of mung trees, painting a mural with a renowned indigenous artist, an annual welcome to country ceremony, Ngarrinjeri language learning, using dot painter Amanda Wesley as inspiration, and the work 'Somebody's Land' as a key learning and teaching resource. In response members congratulated Sarah on her enthusiasm and focus. In response to a question Sarah explained there are 7 staff (2 full time) and 60 students currently at the kindergarten. President Peter then thanked Sarah for a stimulating and truly magnificent presentation and closed the meeting at 8.17pm with the following thought from Simone Weil: 'I can therefore I am', and suggested the quote could well be turned around.
