President Peter than asked members present if they wished to meet on the 17 April and 24 April and noted a 'yes' response. A Rotary anniversary was noted for Sue Dixon, a birthday for Cherilyn and a wedding anniversary for Colin Wormald.

Secretary Marilyn advised members that from now on Board minutes will be sent to all members unless she is advised otherwise. Stuart asked members if there was any interest in a visit to the Glass Exhibition in Adelaide and noted there was none. President Elect Sue distributed draft copies of Board and Committee membership and asked for any members who have concerns to see her after the meeting. Madeleine notified members of a forthcoming concert by the South Coast Choral and Arts Society for which she has tickets.

Chair Bob then invited Barry to conduct the 200 Club Draw and winners were Jeanette, Sergeant Bob and Secretary Marilyn. Segeant Bob collected fines from Sue Dixon for a Rotary Anniversary, Barry Niven for speech length, Peter Manuel for becoming a champion bowler, Madeleine for missing a market sign, the President for the colour of the Sergeant's shirt, Crows supporters, Sue, Ken, Jeanette and Stuart for missing seats, Madeleine for providing wrong information on seats, Alan for trying to regain his licence, Mary-anne for bike dangers, Marilyn for paying Office Shop costs of 25c, and Phil for successfully having a cyst drained on his back.

Chair Bob then introduced Kevin who explained he sits in the car with students in activities such as guessing stopping distances with cones and a dummy. Seat belts, drugs, speeding, inattention and phones are key areas of focus. In response to question he explained ABS and driving position are both covered, farm background students tend to be more proficient so the focus for them is more on traffic. Garry then explained that lessons are good, even in circumstances where a licence is being renewed. Challenges for older drivers include stiffness, vision, reaction time and hearing. In response to questions members noted that 77% of collisions are rear end and speed restrictions are a common problem. In South Australia drivers can still drive a manual vehicle even if they passed their test in an automatic. Eye tests every year are recommended. At a stop sign wheels have to stop behind the line. Cars should allow 1.5 meters distance from bikes and only pass if it is safe to do so. Cars can go over solid lines to overtakes bikes. The Causeway tramline is give way.
